

Hurricane Survival Kit Checklist

This should be one of the first things you prepare. Shop now while the stores are fully stocked. Once you have your survival kit ready, remember that this is for emergency use- Don't use it up before the storm. To make it easier to organize your survival kit, use these checklists:

Food & Water (A 2 week supply of)

- Baby formula/ food
- Bread
- Bottled water (1-2 gallons per person per day-Include pets)
- Canned Meat (tuna, chicken, corned beef, ham)
- Canned Pastas and soups
- Ice
- Salt
- Sugar
- Pepper
- Cookies, Crackers
- Dried fruits
- Dry Cereal
- Energy drinks
- Granola Bars
- Juice
- Shelf packed pudding
- Powered Instant beverages
- Thirst-quenchers such as sport drinks

- Antibacterial hand soap

- Canned fuel or camp stove
- Dishwashing liquid
- Disinfectant spray

- 2-week supply of drinking water
- Animal first-aid book

- Carrier for portable kennel
- Collar with current tags
- Flea & tick treatment
- Heartworm medicine
- Medical records
- Newspaper, paper towels, garbage bags
- Shampoo
- Sturdy leash
- Pet photo stored in a Zip lock bag

Hardware & Other Essentials

- Battery-operated AM/FM radio
- Batter-powered lanterns
- Battery-powered fans
- Blank CD's or DVD's to backup files on your computer
- Bungee cords
- Candles
- Camera with extra film or memory cards and extra batteries
- Chain saw
- Common nails

- Cordless screw gun or drill (charged)
- Disposable dust masks

Power – Batteries & Fuel

- Charcoal

- Rechargeable batteries-for mobile phones, camera's and radios
